





Fig.2 Maximum permissible average forward current as a function of tie-point temperature (including losses due to reverse leakage).





Fig.3 Maximum permissible average forward current as a function of ambient temperature (including losses due to reverse leakage).









Fig.5 Maximum repetitive peak forward current as a function of pulse time (square pulse) and duty factor.

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






